Overseas Screening Suitability Fact Sheet for U.S. Naval Hospitals Rota, Naples, and Sigonella

Updated 1 Jul 2016

Adult conditions that require an inquiry for suitability:

- 1. Conditions Requiring Special Medical Adjuncts (Facility Limitations)
 - Braces/splints (difficulty obtaining parts, supplies and/or repair services)
 - Prosthetics for major limbs (difficulty obtaining parts, supplies and/or repair services)
 - Wheelchair/walkers (difficulty obtaining parts, supplies and/or repair service, no housing modifications, no vehicle modifications, host nation limitations to accessibility/accommodations)
 - Home oxygen (difficulty obtaining equipment, no oxygen concentrators, equipment not delivered)
 - Tracheostomies and/or home ventilators
 - G-Tube/Feeding tube (difficulty obtaining equipment)
 - Ventriculo-peritoneal shunts for treatment/management of hydrocephalus
- 2. Conditions Requiring Special Ancillary Services:
 - Medications not available locally and/or without a readily available substitute (e.g. immune-suppressants, immune-modulators such as TNF-alpha inhibitors)
 - Specialized laboratory monitoring required in a timely fashion (e.g. drug levels)
- 3. Specific medical conditions/treatments:
 - Medical conditions which require follow-up by specialty services not available at Naval Hospital (e. g. cardiology, gastroenterology, endocrinology, pulmonology, allergy and immunology, nephrology, rheumatology, endocrinology, hematology-oncology, podiatry, bowel or bladder rehabilitation services)
 - Bilateral deafness (non-hearing, requiring full time sign language translator)
 - Cancer patients that have required or have a high probability of requiring ongoing oncology services
 - Any progressive neurological condition
 - Severe or moderate persistent asthma; 2 or more hospitalizations for asthma in the past 3 years; 1 or more ICU admission for asthma in the past 3 years
 - Amputation of major limb within the past 2 years
 - Dialysis dependent kidney failure
 - Aplastic anemia or being considered for bone marrow transplant
 - Diabetes Mellitus Type I with poor control or use of insulin pump
 - Body mass index greater than 40
 - Gastric bypass for morbid obesity or any related subsequent complications due to the surgery or the related morbid obesity within the past three years
 - Gastric banding surgery within the last 2 years (USNH Rota does NOT adjust gastric bands)
 - Symptomatic coronary artery disease
 - History of MI, coronary artery bypass grafting, angioplasty, carotid endarterectomy, arterial stenting, or aneurysm repair
 - Cardiac dysrhythmias or arrhythmias, either symptomatic or requiring medication, electro-physiologic control, or automatic implantable cardiac defibrillator
 - Congestive heart failure
 - Recurrent syncope for any reason
 - Active tuberculosis
 - Cystic fibrosis
 - Chronic Pain management in which one year of stability on a medication regimen has NOT been achieved
 - Any medical condition with a high probability of resulting in ICU admissions
 - Organ failure
- 4. Psychiatric Conditions:
 - Within the last 1 year: Lack of symptom stability via psychotherapy and/or medication
 - Within the last 2 years: Active or substantiated family advocacy case
 - Within the last 3 years:
 - Major depressive episode
 - Panic disorder, obsessive compulsive disorder, or any anxiety disorder with panic attacks
 - Within 5 years:
 - Suicide attempt/gesture
 - Eating disorders active
 - Substance use disorder
 - Within the last 10 years:
 - One or more recommendations for or necessity for inpatient psychiatric hospitalizations, day hospitalization, partial hospitalization or residential treatment

- Mental health conditions requiring ongoing individual/family therapy more than once per month
- Personality Disorders
- Psychiatric conditions requiring use of non-formulary medications
- Aggressive, destructive and/or illegal behaviors
- Psychiatric conditions requiring the use of Lithium
- Current or inadequately treated substance dependence or abuse
- Psychotic disorders
- Bipolar disorders
- Dementia
- Factitious disorders
- Dissociative disorders
- Sexual Addiction
- Somatoform disorders
- 5. Gynecologic Conditions:
 - · History of adenocarcinoma in situ
 - History of ovarian, endometrial or uterine cancer
- 6. Obstetrical Conditions:
 - History of postpartum hemorrhage requiring a blood transfusion
 - History of preterm birth before 36 weeks gestational age
 - History of insulin controlled diabetes during pregnancy
 - History of morbid obesity during pregnancy
 - · Any patient previously followed by a Maternal Fetal Medicine Specialist in a previous pregnancy
 - Existing pregnancy complicated by multiple gestations, intra-uterine growth restriction, anti-phospholipid syndrome, cyanotic heart disease, gestational hypertension / pre-eclampsia, isoimmunization, high risk acquired or inherited thrombophilias, peripartum cardiomyopathy, or pulmonary hypertension
- 7. Family members with EFMP Category 3 or higher
- 8. Family members with EFMP Category 6 should have resolution of the condition and be re-evaluated

Pediatric conditions that require an inquiry for suitability:

- 1. Conditions Requiring Special Medical Adjuncts (Facility limitations)
 - Braces/splints (difficulty obtaining parts, supplies and/or repair services)
 - Prosthetics for major limbs (difficulty obtaining parts, supplies and/or repair services)
 - Wheelchair/walkers (difficulty obtaining parts, supplies and/or repair service, no housing modifications, no vehicle modifications, host nation limitations to accessibility/accommodations)
 - Home oxygen (difficulty obtaining equipment, no oxygen concentrators, equipment not delivered)
 - Tracheostomies and/or home ventilators
 - G-Tube/Feeding tube (difficulty obtaining equipment)
 - History of Ventriculo-peritoneal shunts
- 2. Conditions Requiring Special Ancillary Services:
 - Medications not available locally and/or without a readily available substitute (e.g. immune-suppressants, immune-modulators such as TNF-alpha inhibitors)
 - Specialized laboratory monitoring required in a timely fashion (e.g. drug levels)
- 3. Specific Medical Conditions
 - Medical conditions which require follow-up by pediatric subspecialists not available at Naval Hospital Rota more than
 twice per year (e. g. cardiology, gastroenterology, endocrinology, pulmonology, allergy and immunology, nephrology,
 rheumatology, endocrinology, hematology-oncology, podiatry, bowel or bladder rehabilitation)
 - Bilateral deafness (non-hearing, requiring full time sign language translator)
 - Cancer patients that have required or have a high probability of requiring ongoing oncology services
 - History of leukemia or other pediatric cancer
 - Any progressive neurological condition
 - Severe or moderate persistent asthma; 2 or more hospitalizations for asthma in the past 3 years; 1 or more ICU admission for asthma in the past 3 years
 - Amputation of major limb within the past 2 years
 - Dialysis dependent kidney failure
 - Aplastic anemia or being considered for bone marrow transplant
 - Diabetes Mellitus Type I
 - Body mass index greater than 40
 - Congenital Heart Disease
 - Cardiac dysrhythmias or arrhythmias, either symptomatic or requiring therapy
 - Heart failure
 - Recurrent syncope for any reason
 - Active tuberculosis

- Cystic fibrosis or being worked up for cystic fibrosis
- Medical conditions which have a high probability of resulting in ICU admissions
- Organ failure
- 4. Any psychiatric/behavioral conditions (lack of child psychiatry, child psychology, developmental pediatrics, community resources, reform schools, alternative schools and special educational services). These conditions include, but are not limited to:
 - Depressive and anxiety disorders
 - Aggressive, destructive, and/or illegal behaviors
 - Active or history of substance use disorders
 - Conduct Disorder
 - Oppositional Defiant Disorder
 - Any history of juvenile convictions or parole
 - Mental retardation
 - Pervasive Developmental Disorders
 - Tic Disorders
 - Reactive Attachment Disorder
 - Autism Spectrum Disorders
 - Psychotic disorders
 - Bipolar disorders
 - Eating disorders
 - Mood Dysregulation Disorders
 - Any mental health disorder that has required recurrent emergency room visits, inpatient treatment, history of suicidal ideation, self-injurious behavior, or suicide attempts within the last 5 years
 - Foster care placement in the past 3 years
 - Obsessive compulsive disorder with active symptoms within the last year
- 5. Orthopedic Conditions
 - Any limb amputation requiring prosthesis
 - Scoliosis undergoing surgical or brace treatment, or being followed by Pediatric Orthopedics
 - Cerebral Palsy requiring orthopedic surgery or bracing
 - Children being treated for limb lengthinequality
 - Patients with anticipated need for joint replacement surgery
- 6. Speech Therapy, Occupational Therapy with high frequency of visits or extensive need for ongoing services
- 7. Family members with EFMP Category 3 or higher
- 8. Family members with EFMP Category 6 should have resolution of the condition and be re-evaluated
